Read the essential details about trench food. Soldiers in the Western Front were very critical of the quantity and the quality of food they received. The bulk of their diet in the trenches was bully beef (caned corned beef), bread and biscuits. By the winter of 1916 flour was in such short supply that bread was being made with dried ground turnips.

Trenches were not built in straight lines. This was so that if the enemy managed to get into the front line trench they would not have a straight firing line along the trench. Trenches were therefore built with alternating straight and angled lines. The traverse was the name given to the angled parts of the trench. Machine Gun Nest

It would smell like urine, rats and possibly rotting corpses. During a battle one would be almost deafened by artillery and machine gun fire. The food would have been awful. At intervals, dugouts were built into the trench walls, to provide cover and a place to rest. Victor Polhill explained how they were made. To make these things, you cut a piece out of the trench about 3 foot wide and about 4 or 5 feet deep into the side of the trench.
