Catastrophic brain injury, for the purpose of this guideline, is defined as any brain injury that is expected after imaging evaluation and /or clinical exam to result in the permanent loss of all brain function above the brain stem level. NOTE: For patients with potentially survivable but severe Traumatic Brain

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Injury (TBI), refer to Joint Trauma

## **Catastrophic Non-Survivable Brain Injury (CPG ID: 13)**

Catastrophic Brain Injury Guidelines Consider obtaining a critical care consult if not already involved in patient care. See patients' attending physician for orders. Maintain SBP > 100 (MAP > 60)

1. Consider invasive hemodynamic monitoring 2. Adequate hydration: Ensure adequate hydration to maintain euvolemia 3.

For any potential organ donor, prolonged (>20 hours) of active management dramatically increases the chances of successful donation, maximises the number of organs they can donate and optimises both graft function and survival [1-5]. IF, following a

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catastrophic brain injury, the possibility of brainstem death (BSD) is clinically suspected\*

## **Guideline for the Management of the Potential Organ Donor**

Summary: The clinical diagnosis of brain death in a patient with a catastrophic brain injury is determined by a comprehensive clinical examination that involves at least 25 individual assessments. It requires excluding confounding factors first (to confirm futility), examining the patient carefully with special attention to signs of brainstem function, and, finally, performing an apnea test.

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
